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## New Style Dress up #6

### www.asia Clause Dress-Up

In this lesson you will learn the sixth and final dress-up: *www.asia* clause.

This clause is just like a *because* clause except it begins with one of these words: *when, while, where, as, since, if, although*. Memorize these words. An acronym can help: *www.asia*.

*www.asia*

when  
while  
where  
as  
since  
if  
although

Simón Bolívar resolved to free his homeland while he was in Rome.

Simón Bolívar proved his determination when he crossed the Andes.

#### Notice:

1. A *www.asia* clause begins with *when, while, where, as, since, if, although*.

To indicate a *www.asia* clause, underline only the first word of the clause: *when, while, where, as, since, if, although*.

2. A *www.asia* clause contains a subject and a verb.

Simón Bolívar resolved to free his homeland while *he was* in Rome.

Simón Bolívar proved his determination when *he crossed* the Andes.

3. A *www.asia* clause is added to a sentence that is already complete.

*Simón Bolívar resolved to free his homeland* while he was in Rome.

*Simón Bolívar proved his determination* when he crossed the Andes.

- 9 If a *www.asia* clause follows a complete sentence, no comma is needed. If the *www.asia* clause is at the beginning of the sentence, a comma is required.

Simón Bolívar resolved to free his homeland while he was in Rome. (no comma)

Today if you visit South America, you will find memorials to Simón Bolívar. (comma)
