


“Phrased as a Fraction” Instructions

The Concept: Players will have to phrase the Bible statements as a fraction (e.g., “Criminals forgiven on the cross” would be 1 out of 2, or 1/2).

Items Needed: None

Instructions: This game is a team game. Split your group into teams of at least 6 players. Most of the questions are relatively easy (like the example above), but the challenge is in how your group answers. They will need to use their hands to show the answer by holding up fingers for the numbers they need for the fraction. One person will also need to be the bar between the top and bottom number. Here is the example used in the game instructions on how a team would show an answer of 6/13:



The example above would involve 4 players: 1 to make the 6, 1 to make the bar, and 2 to make the 13. Each group will need to designate a group leader who will then shout out “Done!” when their group has the fraction displayed. The game has a screen explaining the hand gestures needed to show the answers, but you may need to go over it a little more with your group to make sure they understand before starting the game.

It is up to the group who they use for each question, but you might have the group leader be in charge of selecting who will be involved in making each answer, being sure to involve everyone in the group. In this case, you may want to let the groups know how many people they will need for the next answer before the next question is shown. This information is listed on the answer key between answers as “people needed for next answer.”

If you want to have the kids answer in a different way and not use the hand gestures at all, delete slide 5, which is the only reference to hand gestures in the game.

Some of the questions require players to know the number of books in the Old and New Testament. You may want to allow the groups to refer to a Bible for assistance with those questions.

Scoring: Groups get one point for each correct answer. For a tiebreaker you could have the tied groups display a large fraction of your choice (maybe including everyone in the group if the teams are even) with the quickest one to do it being the winner.
